11/04/2021 - 16:52	Julie Pindzola	Please fix Northern Arizona	<p>*****Commissioners*****</p> <p>After many many weeks of asking for and explaining why there should be at least one competitive district in Northern Arizona, our requests have LARGELY FALLEN ON DEAF EARS. Thank you Commissioner Lerner for attempting to get some traction for the Verde Valley even though it received zero discussion at the IRC's follow up meeting. The consideration of Northern Arizona was rushed, seemingly almost a forgone conclusion as Commissioners wanted to set the table for their real interests in the Phoenix and Tucson greater metro areas.</p> <p>The inconsistency of your treatment of LD5 vs. LD6/LD7 is just wrong. You deny the legitimate COI of Flagstaff/Verde Valley their own competitive LD (which they have currently) and instead create a gerrymandered district LD7 that runs through 5 counties. Your rationale has been that Yavapai County's LD5 should not be split. How is this reasonable? The criteria of respecting geographic features and intact county borders, and competitiveness all would be enhanced with the Verde Valley going with Flagstaff (See Coconino County Board of Supervisors' submitted LDF050 for LD7). Four instead of 5 counties are split with this improvement. The Dem/GOP split becomes truly competitive at 49.78 to 50.20, whereas the currently drawn split is 35.94 to 64.06. Competition at the ballot box is what this state wants and needs.</p> <p>LD5 could make up for the Verde Valley population by going into Mohave County where rural and conservative sentiments better align. They get their representation without compromising a competitive district next door.</p> <p>The adjacent LD6 version submitted by Coconino County BOS as LDF051 is also a great improvement. It fixes the current problem of packing 71.22% of Democrats into LD6, with the new boundaries showing at 57.9%. This version of LD6 keeps Navajo and Apache counties whole (where they are now split in your current LD6 version) and puts Winslow in with the Native lands. Winslow's Native population is 35%, equal to the White population. The improved LDF051 also does not split Flagstaff off from its nearby region of influence which the current drafted LD6 certainly does.</p> <p>Northern Arizona was a rushed job and minds seemed already made up. We ask that you open you minds and understand the nuances of this very vital part of the state. Thank you, sincerely</p>
