

1 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: We can certainly do another
2 legal review of VRA compliance, you know. That -- that's
3 appropriate.

4 But, colleagues, any other substantive changes or
5 suggestions before Thursday?

6 COMMISSIONER LERNER: This is Commissioner Lerner.
7 Just as a -- oh. I'm sorry, Doug -- Doug Johnson,
8 did you have something?

9 MR. D. JOHNSON: Just on the voting age front, I
10 was just going to ask if the Commission is comfortable as
11 Legal reviews the numbers and if we do come up with a theory
12 of something that might make the map more defensible, would
13 the Commission be comfortable if we draw that today or
14 tomorrow and bring it to you on Thursday instead of waiting
15 to get direction on Thursday?

16 MR. HERRERA: Commission -- Chairwoman?

17 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Yes.

18 MR. B. JOHNSON: Can I just make a comment real
19 quick? I just want to clear the record and make sure
20 there's no misunderstanding. That VRA data for which the
21 Commission is going to be analyzing for CD-3, CD-7, whatever
22 legislative district, will be coming from Timmons as well as
23 Lisa Handley who is part of NDC.

24 Of course the Commission, at any time, can ask for
25 clarification or legal guidance on that, but I didn't want

1 any -- anybody in the public to misunderstand there was a
2 legal analysis that was outside of the scope.

3 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Correct. We are seeking --
4 ongoing we have been seeking legal advice based on the data
5 provided to us from Timmons/NDC.

6 I'm in -- I'm in favor of that, Doug. And, in
7 fact, I mean, I wouldn't mind, you know, if we took a look a
8 look at the letter from -- from the mayor of Tucson, I could
9 take a look at some of the ideas, and if there are some
10 ideas from the mayor of Tucson that are somewhat compatible
11 or fit in with some of Commissioner Lerner's ideas -- you
12 know, I don't feel the need to blow this map up and we do
13 have a lot of changes, but if there's a way to fine tune it
14 before the close of day Thursday, I find that to be
15 attractive.

16 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Chairwoman Neuberg, if we were
17 going to make any changes in Southern Arizona I would want
18 to give some opinions, and so I would either like to sort of
19 not do that or know that we're doing it and then I would
20 speak up.

21 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Is it --

22 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: What about what Doug asks,
23 though, as it relates to the majority-minority?

24 COMMISSIONER MEHL: In District 3 I will leave --
25 leave that one to Commissioner York.

1 COMMISSIONER YORK: I'm in favor of looking at that
2 if there's some way to make that more compliant.

3 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay.

4 COMMISSIONER LERNER: This is Commissioner Lerner.

5 I actually think that, because the Mayor's letter
6 came in while we're still having these discussions, we
7 should take a look at it while we're still deliberating at
8 this point. It may be that we can't include everything,
9 there may be some things that are little bit different than
10 what we were thinking; but I think there's some things maybe
11 there may be overlap between what Commissioner Mehl and I
12 had proposed as well already, so it might be that we're
13 already somewhat aligned with a lot of those things.

14 So I think on Thursday we should take a look at it.
15 I -- I looked at it very briefly this morning, the letter,
16 but I did not have time to study it to see how it compares
17 to both what I was suggesting as well as what Commissioner
18 Mehl has suggested.

19 But I -- I think it came in in time for us. I
20 think it's worth us taking a look at.

21 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Just as a clarification,
22 Commissioner Lerner. Her only letter only dealt with -- at
23 least on my quick reading, it only dealt with the
24 congressional districts.

25 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Okay.

1 COMMISSIONER MEHL: It did not deal with the LDs.

2 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Ah.

3 COMMISSIONER MEHL: So that's why I was saying what
4 I was saying.

5 COMMISSIONER YORK: Well, and my concern is it was
6 only -- I think we received it ten minutes before we started
7 the call this morning, so we need some time to review it. I
8 have no problem looking at it on Thursday or considering her
9 suggestions on Thursday.

10 COMMISSIONER LERNER: That would be great. That's
11 all -- and I -- I would agree, then. I had not taken a
12 close enough look at it so I appreciate that clarification
13 on that, but I think it's worth taking a look on Thursday
14 because it might just be tweaking some boundaries here and
15 there that -- and it relates to some of the -- the maps that
16 have been submitted as well.

17 So if we can do that, that will be great.

18 COMMISSIONER YORK: Right.

19 COMMISSIONER LERNER: As far as the
20 congressional -- and I -- and I know, Commissioner York, you
21 need to head out, so I don't want -- my suggestion is that I
22 do have a couple of thoughts, but to keep us moving today,
23 if -- if it would be okay, my suggestions on -- and I tell
24 you up front so, Commissioner York, you can always take a
25 look in advance of that area.

1 But I was kind of looking at ideas of adding
2 Sunnyslope in the North Mountain Preserve into District 1,
3 and then we -- and we can talk about this more in detail on
4 Thursday; Cave Creek, Carefree, New River, Anthem, that
5 area, into District 8.

6 And because I think Sunnyslope and North Mountain
7 areas are more aligned for District 1.

8 But, Commissioner York, for the sake of time, would
9 it be okay for us to have that discussion then on Thursday
10 where we take a little bit closer look at that, look at
11 the -- some of the school districts, population changes, and
12 all of that?

13 COMMISSIONER YORK: Sure.

14 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Just to give you an overview,
15 that's kind of what I was looking at for just that one area
16 as part of that.

17 But respecting your time, I don't want to...

18 COMMISSIONER YORK: No, I -- yeah, and we can look
19 at that on Thursday.

20 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: And that sounds like that --
21 those are small enough adjustments that we could -- well,
22 you know, I'm speaking for Mapping. I'm presuming that's
23 small enough adjustments we can do that in somewhat of a
24 timely way.

25 COMMISSIONER YORK: It's a big chunk of population

1 is the problem.

2 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Right.

3 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Chairwoman, I would then
4 suggest that on Thursday, we quickly dive into the
5 congressional map first.

6 COMMISSIONER YORK: Right.

7 COMMISSIONER MEHL: So that Mapping might would
8 have a chance to make some adjustments during the day; and
9 then with the LD maps hopefully we're picking between one of
10 the three to move forward with and not making further
11 adjustments. I think that would then work out well, and we
12 can still be timely on Thursday.

13 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: I would just like to have
14 people have appropriate expectations.

15 I expect that when we adopt a map and we vote on an
16 LD map, I expect that there's going to be ongoing
17 deliberation.

18 I have a --

19 COMMISSIONER MEHL: That's --

20 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Look, if we -- if we have a
21 5-0 vote on one of those three options to start with, we're
22 done.

23 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Yeah.

24 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: If we don't, we're going to
25 be deliberating a while.

1 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Yeah.

2 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Just one other quick spot
3 just to try to expedite. And, again, I'm trying to respect
4 Commissioner York, but I could -- I could give the changes,
5 the proposed changes, so that they have it in advance on
6 Thursday for us to look at?

7 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: No. All -- all
8 recommendations to Mapping must be done in public.

9 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Okay.

10 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: No -- no private
11 instructions.

12 COMMISSIONER LERNER: No, I understand that. I
13 could do that now that I've given Commissioner York sort of
14 the overview, I just wanted to -- I could give specific ones
15 today so that he knows what I was -- I just wanted him to be
16 aware of sort of what I -- the direction.

17 But, otherwise, I can do it more specifically on
18 Thursday. Whatever is best.

19 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay.

20 COMMISSIONER YORK: Thursday.

21 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: I think we have a great plan,
22 I think we're setting ourselves up for success on Thursday,
23 and we're really close.

24 And I -- I just really want to thank my colleagues.
25 I mean, your -- your knowledge, your command of everything

1 that we're learning, it's -- you're doing an amazing job and
2 you're doing it in a collegial way and remarkably with
3 remarkable good faith.

4 So I'm really excited for Thursday and -- and even
5 more excited for what comes after that with, you know, a
6 whole new learning session, so.

7 COMMISSIONER YORK: Thank you,
8 Commissioner Neuberg. I am going to bow out.

9 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Thank you. Please note for
10 the --

11 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: -- minutes that
13 Commissioner York is leaving at 9:06.

14 Thanks for the accommodation, Commissioner York.

15 (Whereupon Commissioner York exits the meeting at
16 9:06 a.m.)

17 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: See you, Doug.

18 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Bye.

19 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Safe travels.

20 Okay. Anything else, colleagues on Agenda
21 Item No. VI?

22 Okay.

23 MR. FLAHAN: So just to confirm on congressional,
24 there's no changes unless we need to make changes to
25 District 3 for VRA compliance; is that correct, for

1 Thursday?

2 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Right. Doug mentioned
3 that -- that, you know, based on the data, there may be some
4 ideas that he'd like to show us as it relates to honoring
5 the VRA or just communities of interest, you know, our
6 minorities communities of interest, and I'm very open minded
7 to looking at that.

8 MR. FLAHAN: Gotcha.

9 Also, Brian has the redistricting system up. You
10 will see two new columns that are in the table, G_AINH18,
11 and G_AINH18_P, and that was the non-Hispanic/Native
12 American single race VAP that was shown in the demographics,
13 that new piece that was requested by Vice Chair Watchman.

14 So that is now found in the AZ standard
15 demographics as the last column. You can turn on or turn
16 off in any of the submitted maps. So that's where you can
17 find that data in the redistricting system.

18 And I believe you're up to over 140 submitted maps.

19 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: How -- how are -- how is our
20 public response compared to other states around the nation?
21 How is our state engaging?

22 MR. FLAHAN: I have not checked the numbers lately,
23 but I would say you possibly surpass other states.

24 But I can check the numbers, and I can let you know
25 on Thursday.

1 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: We're keeping you busy, I
2 think.

3 MR. FLAHAN: Yes, with all the changes and all the
4 draft maps, yes. We've been gearing all of our focus to
5 that and making sure that that's working.

6 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: And we have a very active,
7 engaged state and we're a very proud of everybody.

8 All right.

9 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Chair Neuberg?

10 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Yes.

11 COMMISSIONER LERNER: I have a comment. I don't
12 know whether it's better to take it today, it's not
13 requesting a specific change at this point for the
14 congressional. I could make -- it's just sort of making a
15 comment about -- sort of maybe setting the stage for the
16 public to kind of be thinking about some things.

17 Do you think it would be better to do things on
18 Thursday as we completely finish our deliberations for each
19 of the maps? It might be a good context.

20 But it's a concern I have about one of the
21 districts, but I'm not going to be requesting any changes to
22 it at this time because I think we need to hear from the
23 public on it.

24 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: You know, maybe -- if there's
25 something you want to share, please share now. Otherwise, I

1 do think it may be appropriate when -- when we vote.

2 We're all going to vote and none of us are going to
3 perfectly like the map. I mean, there's going to be parts
4 of the map that we don't agree with. And I think that we
5 can have an affirmative vote as a sign of, you know, good
6 faith of putting a draft that's consensus.

7 And, look, I mean, everybody will make their own
8 choices on that vote, but people can clarify, you know, what
9 they like and what they don't like and what they want to
10 work on, because we'll have, you know, six more weeks of --
11 of delib- -- of essentially deliberations.

12 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Right. I'll hold off until
13 Thursday, then. I think -- I think that's a good idea.

14 Thank you.

15 MR. FLAHAN: Brian, could you -- could you walk
16 through how to provide feedback on the maps, that way the
17 public can -- can have a good tutorial on that?

18 MR. KINGERY: Sure.

19 There's a couple of different places that you can
20 do that. Right here on the "publish plans" page on this
21 dashboard there is a link to provide feedback on any plan
22 that has been published, whether it's congressional,
23 legislative or a single-district submission.

24 If you click this "provide feedback" tab, what will
25 happen is you will taking -- taken to a form and when you

1 click a specific "provide feedback for a plan," that data
2 will be ported over so that you can -- so you don't have to
3 type out the exact number of the plan that you would like to
4 provide feedback on.

5 Once you're in the form, you can change, so you can
6 change your -- change what you want to provide feedback on.
7 So if it's a specific draft map, you can put in which
8 version of congressional or legislative; or if you want to
9 go all the way back to the approved grid maps, you can
10 provide comment on either or both.

11 And then it's the same general questions that we
12 asked on the initial listening tour about name, e-mail
13 address, are you submitting on behalf of an organization,
14 are you being paid to submit comments.

15 And this survey is accessible both in English and
16 Spanish.

17 MR. FLAHAN: Thanks.

18 And you can also do that from the draft -- from the
19 draft map page, correct?

20 MR. KINGERY: Correct.

21 So here we have the different series broken out.
22 Below each title is "provide feedback," so it will take that
23 same information of that specific plan and put that into the
24 survey to go ahead and give you a head start.

25 Also on the bottom of the published plans page is

1 the form, is the blank form also available -- it's the same
2 form, just blank; and then also in the published plan viewer
3 you can click the bubble icon next to it, and that's just
4 simply another way to access it.

5 So we put it in a couple of different places for
6 ease of access.

7 MR. FLAHAN: Thanks, Brian.

8 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Yeah, I would like to really
9 thank you. Every week you continue to make all of our --
10 our links more user-friendly, all of the different mapping
11 tools, and they're just constant improvement and ease of
12 use. So, thank you.

13 Okay.

14 MR. FLAHAN: With that, that's all we've got from
15 the mapping side.

16 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. Thank you so much.

17 And with that, we'll move to Agenda Item No. VII,
18 Executive Director's report and discussion thereof.

19 We have two items: Listening tour and budget
20 update. I turn it over to Brian and Lori.

21 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: Thank you, Madam Chair. I am
22 going to let Lori discuss the tour just briefly.

23 MS. NEUMANN: She'll be there in just a moment.

24 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: Thank you.

25 MS. VAN HAREN: I'm so sorry, Madam Chair. I don't

1 know if you can hear me, my device disconnected for a
2 second.

3 So I wanted to let everybody know we are going to
4 announce the final list of all of the locations, dates,
5 times and everything at the meeting first thing on Thursday
6 morning at 9:30. And so if anybody has any questions,
7 please let me know.

8 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: The only thing that I want to
9 add is I know the public and the Commissioners are waiting
10 anxious -- anxiously for us to lock in this days.

11 What we're finding -- or what I'm learning, I'm
12 sure event planners already know this, is doing a tour like
13 this is kind of like doing a map, it's all a ripple effect.
14 And so one little change then ripples through all of the
15 other calendars; and we are trying to take in as much of the
16 community feedback about the locations and so I appreciate
17 everybody's patience, it's just a lot of moving pieces to
18 try to, you know, get it as right as we can.

19 So thank you staff for -- for continuing to stay on
20 it to make it work as best as possible.

21 Anything on the budget?

22 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: Not today. We will have an
23 updated budget for you on Thursday.

24 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. You got it.

25 If there are no other questions, we can hold off

1 the conversations on these issues until Thursday maybe when
2 our mapping team is busy working.

3 If nothing else, we'll move to Agenda Item
4 No. VIII, discussion of future agenda item requests.

5 One thing that I know that I've wanted to make sure
6 it's on a future agenda item is I would like for us to be
7 able to talk through plans for deliberation in December
8 both, you know, method and specific dates. I have some
9 ideas in mind about, you know, what works, what doesn't
10 work, what would better work for me; we also, though, just
11 have the realities of time constraints.

12 And so before we conclude today, I'm actually going
13 to ask Commissioners to go through our calendar. But that's
14 a topic that I'd like on a future agenda item.

15 Anything else from our colleagues?

16 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Chairwoman, to amplify what you
17 just said on that, I think that's an important topic; and
18 for me, personally, it was difficult doing basically five
19 days in a row, Friday and then four days, without having
20 time to really take a step back and getting -- and being
21 able to stare at revised maps.

22 I would like everyone to at least think about two
23 days, a break, two days, a break, two days. May be six
24 total days with a couple of breaks in there if we can make
25 that work calendarwise, but I think we will be more

1 productive and -- and have less chance of a heart attack if
2 we did it that way.

3 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Commissioner Mehl, I'm
4 cracking up because that's it literal -- I literally said
5 to, you know, some of the broader team: Two days on, one
6 day off, two days on.

7 I think we all understand that we get fried, the
8 information is flying by us very fast; Particularly for me
9 needing a little bit of time to be understanding where my
10 colleagues are going with their visions. There's a
11 practical issue with Mapping and, you know, they have to set
12 up and they can't just disassemble and set up and
13 disassemble and the length of time here; but we'll work it
14 out.

15 Let's set up a time to, you know, robustly talk
16 about it, but I think we are all on the same page, and I'd
17 actually suggest that we try to find eight days of
18 deliberation ending the 22nd, so that we know that we have
19 the full amount of time and don't feel pressure. And if we
20 don't use them, we don't use them.

21 COMMISSIONER LERNER: And this is Sher- -- this is
22 Commissioner Lerner. I just want to say I'm completely on
23 the same page as well, that was the same thought of giving
24 us a little bit of time in between here and there to take a
25 breath, take a look, and think about where things are.

1 Sometimes the urgency of the moment isn't always as accurate
2 as what it could be if you could say: Oh, wait, you know
3 what, that could be okay.

4 So, thank you.

5 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay.

6 Any other item -- agenda items you would --

7 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: Well, I agree. This is Vice
8 Chair Watchman. And if we have to do it on a weekend, two
9 days on, one day off, that's fine, too. But December
10 obviously is going to be short because of the holidays and
11 so, you know, if we can run through it, I'm okay with that.

12 I did share with staff a couple days that I'm not
13 available, but generally I think I'm available for most of
14 December, so. We can run it even on weekends, I'm okay with
15 that.

16 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: If you have your calendars
17 open right now, we can run through it.

18 It's Agenda Item X, next meeting date. You know,
19 we can look through the our calendars. You guys want to
20 look at the schedules moving back from December 22nd?

21 Or would you rather, you know, submit your dates to
22 staff?

23 COMMISSIONER LERNER: Well, Commissioner York isn't
24 here so that would be the only concern. But we could still
25 pull together some dates and then provide him opportunities

1 to get his input as well.

2 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Why don't we just if you have
3 your calendars ahead of you.

4 Is everybody free the 20th, 21st, and 22nd? I know
5 that's three consecutive days, but hopefully the 22nd will
6 be celebration.

7 COMMISSIONER LERNER: I'm available those days.

8 COMMISSIONER MEHL: I'm available all those days.

9 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: I as well; I'm open.

10 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. And I believe actually
11 that York may be as well, I don't have his calendar.

12 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: I do have it and he is available
13 those days.

14 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. So that's three.

15 The previous week.

16 COMMISSIONER MEHL: My only issue is on the 17th, I
17 would need to leave about 3 o'clock; it's a Friday.

18 Otherwise, I'm available the whole week.

19 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: I think -- I'm not available
20 on the 13th and 14th and maybe half -- on the morning on the
21 15th.

22 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: And Commissioner York is not
23 available on the 15th.

24 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: Okay.

25 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. So it sounds like that

1 week the 13th, 14th, 15th is out. So we have the 16th and
2 the 17th up until 3:00 p.m.?

3 COMMISSIONER MEHL: That would -- that would be
4 good.

5 The previous week?

6 COMMISSIONER LERNER: So the only thing on the 17th
7 is if we could start -- I know it would make a shorter day,
8 but I have a board meeting in the morning at 7:30. So if I
9 could at least attend half of that, if we could just start
10 at 8:30 that day just instead of 8:00; I can leave the
11 meeting early.

12 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: I can already tell working
13 backwards we're not going to have enough days and we may
14 need to look at weekends.

15 So let's look at the week of -- of the 6th.

16 COMMISSIONER LERNER: I'm available the whole day
17 the 17th, just starting -- if we can just start a half hour
18 later on that day that's all.

19 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay.

20 COMMISSIONER MEHL: 8:30 to 3:00. That day is
21 still a pretty full day.

22 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Yes.

23 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Yeah.

24 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. So we have five days
25 so far.

1 COMMISSIONER LERNER: I'm available --

2 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: I'm open the whole entire
3 week of December 6th.

4 COMMISSIONER MEHL: The 10th is the only day I have
5 a major conflict.

6 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: And Commissioner York isn't
7 available the 7th or 8th.

8 COMMISSIONER LERNER: I'm -- all week.

9 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Either the 6th -- so it looks
10 like the 6th or 7th and the 9th.

11 DIRECTOR SCHMITT: Not the 7th; York isn't
12 available that day.

13 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. Well I think we found
14 dates: 6, 9, 16, 17, 20, 21, 22.

15 And -- and -- and we can talk with Mapping about
16 efficiency. You know, we start on the 6th, we may not leave
17 until the 9th, maybe the 6th is virtual, it's just going to
18 be maybe like today, sharing the initial, you know, visions,
19 which will subsequently lead to major shakeup in the maps
20 we're presuming; so then it would lead to few solid days of
21 map drawing followed then by the 9th where we can come in
22 and physically deliberate.

23 We don't have to talk the details, but I think this
24 is at least a helpful start and we can continue to make sure
25 that this stays on the agenda so that we can further, you

1 know, discuss what works for us.

2 Okay.

3 Okay. No other agenda item requests it sounds
4 like.

5 Agenda Item IX, announcements. We have our
6 deliberation day on Thursday, we will be starting at 9:30,
7 and we will be going until we have a draft map.

8 Oh. And then the other announcement is there is no
9 plan at this point to have a business meeting next Tuesday.
10 There's -- we don't anticipate additional business that we
11 won't be able to address this Thursday, so your next Tuesday
12 should be free.

13 Agenda Item No. X, next meeting date. Thursday
14 deliberation, 9:30.

15 Which moves us to Agenda Item No. XI, closing of
16 public comments.

17 Please note members of the Commission may not
18 discuss items that are not specifically identified on the
19 agenda. Therefore, pursuant to A.R.S. 38-431.01(H), action
20 taken as a result of public comment will be limited to
21 directing staff to study the matter, responding to any
22 criticism, or scheduling the matter for further
23 consideration or decision at a later date.

24 And with that, we move to Item No. XII,
25 adjournment.

1 I will open up a motion to adjourn.

2 COMMISSIONER LERNER: This is Commissioner Lerner.

3 I would move to adjourn.

4 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Commissioner Mehl seconds.

5 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: Vice Chair Watchman seconds.

6 COMMISSIONER MEHL: Okay. Anybody.

7 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Okay. Vice Chair Watchman
8 seconds.

9 We'll take a vote.

10 Vice Chair Watchman.

11 VICE CHAIR WATCHMAN: Aye.

12 CHAIRPERSON NEUBERG: Commissioner Mehl.
